## SAHRC partners with Foundation for Human Rights and Department of Justice to to celebrate the International Day Against Homophobia, Transphobia, and Biphobia.

The South African Human Rights Commission together with the Foundation for Human Rights and the Department of Justice and Constitutional Development celebrated the International Day Against Homophobia, Transphobia and Biphobia at the SAHRC Head office on 17 May 2018.

Community based organisations and non-governmental organisations voiced their concerns that despite legislative frameworks, challenges such as stigma and the raping and killing of lesbian women, continues.

Deputy Chairperson Priscilla Jana highlighted some of the work the SAHRC has done in advancing the realisation of SOGIE persons rights.

The Deputy Minister of Justice, John Jeffrey indicated that South Africa has a responsibility to advocate for the realisation of LGBTI rights even in other countries like Uganda where SOGIE persons are prosecuted on a daily basis.


